

CONCLUSION

Incisional hernia is really a problem to the patient and to the surgeon. So, the present work was designed to study the aetiological factors contributing to the occurrence of postoperative hernia.

After reviewing this problem in details, we now know for sure that it is a preventable disease. Although there are so many ways to treat incisional hernia; yet the success rate does not exceed 75-78%.

Usually the anatomy is distorted and we are always faced with the problem of tissue loss. Synthetic materials, although they are ideal to fill gaps, but usually these patients have a very poor healing power, with low resistance and high incidence of infection and run easily into postoperative complications.

These items have to be taken into consideration and the patient should be brought into an ideal state before embarking on any operation. Incisional hernia will remain a challenge to the surgeon's competence and skill.
