

SUMMARY

The objective of this work is to review and demonstrate the role of radiology in diagnosis of bladder tumours with a significant relevance to cancer bladder, clarifying the merits of radiological investigations and comparison with each others followed by a suggested scheme of clinic-radiological diagnosis of cancer bladder cases.

Although the cystoscope is still more accurate in diagnosis of bladder tumour, clinical examination and bimanual examination under anaesthesia is considered an important step in evaluating tumour infiltration of the wall of the bladder.

Radiology is the best diagnostic tool before cystoscopy in diagnosis and staging of bladder tumours.
