The Effectiveness Of A Counseling Program For Early Intervention In Preventing The Delinquency Of An Adolescents Group Who are At-Risk Of Deviation

The study aims to design a counseling program for early intervention to prevent the delinquency of an adolescents group who face the risk of delinquency. The researcher designed a list for the early discovery of the most significant psychological disorders that distinguish adolescents who face the risk of delinquency (The Pre-Delinquency Psychological Disorders List). The list consists of four main disorders: (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Conduct Disorder (CD), Emotional Psychological Disorders (EPD) and Scholastic Skills Disorder (SSD)). The researcher adopted the experimental method and conducted a pre-test, post-test and follow up test on both the experimental and the control groups. The sample consisted of (20) male students at the second grade of prep-school. The study sample was divided into two groups: (THE Experimental Group, The Control Group), their ages ranged from (13-15) years old.

The researcher took into her consideration matching the two groups as to the variables of age, social/economic /cultural status and intelligence. The score on the test use for discoring the risk of delinquency. The study reached that there are statistical differences favor the grades of the experimental group members over the grades of the controlling group members in the post-test using the list of pre-delinquency psychological disorders.
