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## INTRODUCTION

Although acute diseases of the children are more common than chronic ones, the majority of them can be effectively controlled through adequate medication and hospitalization. On the other hand, chronic childhood disorders (C.C.D.), in spite of being less frequent, they require the integrity of medical and paramedical personnel, health centers, clinics, home and school environment in order to assure the proper control of the disease process, its complications or sequelae including the physical and psychological ones.

This emphasize the great requirement for proper care and long-term management measures to minimize the effects of such diseases.

Aim of the work: Is to study the care and long-term management measures of C.C.D. in developing countries to evaluate their use and applications in a country like Egypt. This will be done by reviewing the following aspects:
