INTRODUCTION

Enteric fever include infections with sulmonella typhi, salmonella paratyphi A, salmonella paratyphi B and salmonella paratyphi C. These fevers are generalised systemic infections from ingestion of the causal organism, characterised by fever gastrointestinal and systemic manifestations and at times localised inflammatory lesions. A typical exanthem consisting of "rose-spots" occur in about 10% of cases (Lawson, 1977).
